2. **Nomination Process (Rules 7-32 to 7-35):** The State Convention nominates candidates for various offices to be elected at the next general election.
 - I. **Presidential Year Candidates up for Nomination at the Convention:** Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Delegates for the National Convention, Candidates for Presidential Electors.
 - II. **Mid-Term Year Candidates up for Nomination at the Convention:** Secretary of State, Treasurer, Auditor, Party Platform Adoption
3. **Platform Adoption (Rule 7-36):** The party platform is adopted at the **State Convention in mid-term election years.** [Party Platform PDF](#)
